**CEQA Appeal Rights under Chapter 31 of the San Francisco Administrative Code**: If the Commission's action on a project constitutes the Approval Action for that project (as defined in S.F. Administrative Code Chapter 31, as amended, Board of Supervisors Ordinance Number 161-13), then the CEQA determination prepared in support of that Approval Action is thereafter subject to appeal within the time frame specified in S.F. Administrative Code Section 31.16. Typically, an appeal must be filed within 30 calendar days of the Approval Action for a project that has received an exemption or negative declaration pursuant to CEQA. For information on filing an appeal under Chapter 31, contact the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors at City Hall, 1 Dr. Carlton B. Goodlett Place, Room 244, San Francisco, CA 94102, or call (415) 554-5184. If the Planning Department's Environmental Review Officer has deemed a project to be exempt from further environmental review, an exemption determination has been prepared and can be obtained on-line at <a href="http://www.sf-planning.org/index.aspx?page=3447">http://www.sf-planning.org/index.aspx?page=3447</a>. Under CEQA, in a later court challenge, a litigant may be limited to raising only those issues previously raised at a hearing on the project or in written correspondence delivered to the Board of Supervisors, Planning Commission, Planning Department or San Francisco Public Utilities Commission at, or prior to, such hearing, or as part of the appeal hearing process on the CEQA decision.

All matters listed hereunder constitute a Consent Calendar, are considered to be routine by the San Francisco Public Utilities Commission, and will be acted upon by a single vote of the Commission. - a) Approve Modification No. 1 to Job Order Contract (JOC), JOC-64, General Building (B-License) for San Francisco, San Mateo, Santa Clara, and Alameda Counties with Rubecon Builders, Inc., to perform general building construction tasks for all San Francisco Public Utilities Commission enterprise operations and bureaus, increasing the contract amount by \$2,500,000, and increasing the contract duration by one year, for a total contract amount of \$7,500,000 and a total contract duration of five years, as allowed for contracts executed under San Francisco Administrative Code Chapter 6.62 Job Order Contracts (f) and (g). (How)
- b) Award <u>Agreement No. PRO.0101</u>, Tunnel Engineering Services for the proposed Folsom Area Stormwater Improvement Project; approve the selection of McMillen Jacobs Associates/Stantec Joint Venture to provide design services for the proposed tunnel; and authorize the General Manager to negotiate and execute a professional services agreement for a total amount not-to-exceed \$5,700,000, with a duration of 18 months. - c) Accept work performed by NTK Construction, Inc. for <u>Contract No. WD-</u>2654R, Peninsula Vegetation Removal; approve Modification No.8 (Final), decreasing the contract amount by \$261,774, for a total contract amount of \$11,807,189, and increasing the contract duration by 65 consecutive calendar days (approximately three months), for a total contract duration of 815 consecutive calendar days (approximately two years and three months); and authorize final payment to the contractor. - d) Approve an increase to the existing contract duration contingency of an additional 215 consecutive calendar days (approximately seven months) for <u>Contract No. WD-2686</u>, Auxiliary Water Supply System Pumping Station No. 1 Improvements (2014); and authorize the General Manager to approve future modifications to the contract for a total contract duration of up to 1,653 consecutive calendar days (approximately four years and six months), with no change to contract amount. - e) Approve the plans and specifications, and award <u>Contract No. WW-627R</u>, Baker Beach Green Streets, in the amount of \$7,122,000, with a duration of 530 consecutive calendar days (approximately one year and five months), to the lowest, qualified, responsible and responsive bidder, Minerva Construction Inc., to construct green infrastructure, replace water and sewer lines, and repave portions of El Camino del Mar, Seacliff Avenue, and 25<sup>th</sup> Avenue.
