The closest accessible BART station is the Civic Center Station at United Nations Plaza and Market Street. <u>CEQA Appeal Rights under Chapter 31 of the San Francisco Administrative Code</u>: If the Commission's action on a project constitutes the Approval Action for that project (as defined in S.F. Administrative Code Chapter 31, as amended, Board of Supervisors Ordinance Number 161-13), then the CEQA determination prepared in support of that Approval Action is thereafter subject to appeal within the time frame specified in S.F. Administrative Code Section 31.16. Typically, an appeal must be filed within 30 calendar days of the Approval Action for a project that has received an exemption or negative declaration pursuant to CEQA. For information on filing an appeal under Chapter 31, contact the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors at City Hall, 1 Dr. Carlton B. Goodlett Place, Room 244, San Francisco, CA 94102, or call (415) 554-5184. If the Planning Department's Environmental Review Officer has deemed a project to be exempt from further environmental review, an exemption determination has been prepared and can be obtained on-line at http://www.sf-planning.org/index.aspx?page=3447. Under CEQA, in a later court challenge, a litigant may be limited to raising only those issues previously raised at a hearing on the project or in written correspondence delivered to the Board of Supervisors, Planning Commission, Planning Department or San Francisco Public Utilities Commission at, or prior to, such hearing, or as part of the appeal hearing process on the CEQA decision.

All matters listed hereunder constitute a Consent Calendar, are considered to be routine by the San Francisco Public Utilities Commission and will be acted upon by a single vote of the Commission. There will be no separate discussion of these items unless a member of the Commission or the public so requests, in which event the matter will be removed from the Calendar and considered as a separate item.
 - a) Approve Amendment No. 2 to <u>Agreement No. PRO.0029</u>, Project Pull Internship Services, with the Japanese Community Youth Council, to continue providing administrative services and technical assistance for the Project Pull Internship Program; and authorize the General Manager to execute this amendment, increasing the agreement by \$800,000 for a total contract amount not-to-exceed \$3,300,000, with no change to the contract duration.  - b) Approve the selection of Carollo Engineers, Inc./Water Resources Engineering, Inc. Joint Venture (Carollo/WRE JV); award Agreement No. PRO.0118, Water Resources Professional Services, to provide specialized and technical services for water resources management, conservation planning and program support for the Water Resources Division of the Water Enterprise; and authorize the General Manager to negotiate and execute a professional services agreement with Carollo/WRE JV for an amount not-to-exceed \$4,000,000, and with a duration of five years.

- d) Approve an increase in the amount of \$4,316,159 to the existing contract cost contingency, and an increase of 220 calendar days (approximately seven months) to the existing contract duration contingency, for Contract No. WD-2729, Fish Passage Facilities within the Alameda Creek Watershed, a sub-project of the Calaveras Dam Replacement Project; and authorize the General Manager to approve future modifications to the contract for a total contract amount of up to \$44,757,805 and a total contract duration of up to 1,289 consecutive calendar days (approximately three years and seven months).
