**CEQA Appeal Rights under Chapter 31 of the San Francisco Administrative Code**: If the Commission's action on a project constitutes the Approval Action for that project (as defined in S.F. Administrative Code Chapter 31, as amended, Board of Supervisors Ordinance Number 161-13), then the CEQA determination prepared in support of that Approval Action is thereafter subject to appeal within the time frame specified in S.F. Administrative Code Section 31.16. Typically, an appeal must be filed within 30 calendar days of the Approval Action for a project that has received an exemption or negative declaration pursuant to CEQA. For information on filing an appeal under Chapter 31, contact the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors at City Hall, 1 Dr. Carlton B. Goodlett Place, Room 244, San Francisco, CA 94102, or call (415) 554-5184. If the Planning Department's Environmental Review Officer has deemed a project to be exempt from further environmental review, an exemption determination has been prepared and can be obtained on-line at http://www.sf-planning.org/index.aspx?page=3447. Under CEQA, in a later court challenge, a litigant may be limited to raising only those issues previously raised at a hearing on the project or in written correspondence delivered to the Board of Supervisors, Planning Commission, Planning Department or San Francisco Public Utilities Commission at, or prior to, such hearing, or as part of the appeal hearing process on the CEQA decision.

- a) Approve <u>Contract No. CS-1415</u>, Joint Funding Agreement with the U.S. Geological Survey, for Hydrologic Monitoring and Stream and Reservoir Gauge Maintenance on the Tuolumne River and its Tributaries, for an amount contributed by the San Francisco Public Utilities Commission not to exceed \$1,938,680 and with a duration of four years and 11 months. - b) Approve Amendment No. 3 to <u>Contract No. CS-389</u>, Planning and Engineering Services Southeast Plant New 250 MGD Headworks Facility, with Carollo Engineering, Inc., increasing the contract amount by \$3,000,000, for a total not-to-exceed contract amount of \$57,500,000, with no change to the contract duration, to continue providing wastewater process facility engineering design and engineering support services during construction. - d) Award <u>Contract No. WD-2720</u>, 8-Inch Ductile Iron Water Main Replacement, 16-Inch and 24-Inch Earthquake Resistant Ductile Iron Water Main Installation, Sewer Replacement, and Pavement Renovation on Coso and Precita Avenues from Coleridge to Bryant, to the responsible bidder that submitted the lowest responsive bid, Mitchell Engineering, in the amount \$8,633,150 and with a duration of 745 consecutive calendar days (approximately two years and one month), to install approximately 3,100 feet of earthquake resistant ductile iron water conveyance pipe, 2,100 feet of ductile iron water conveyance pipe, 1,100 feet of sewer pipe, ancillary water service pipe, curb ramps, and pavement restoration. This action constitutes the Approval Action for the Project for the purposes of the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA), pursuant to San Francisco Administrative Code section 31.04(h). The Planning Department has determined that the Project is exempt from the CEQA. The Commission will rely on that determination to make its decision on this action. (Robinson)

- e) Award <u>Contract No. WD-2765</u>, 8-Inch and 16-Inch Ductile Iron Water Main Replacement on Jersey Street from Douglass Street to Church Street and Various Street Locations, to the responsible bidder that submitted the lowest responsive bid, M. Squared Construction, Inc., in the amount of \$10,202,490 and with a duration of 731 consecutive calendar days (approximately two years), to replace existing water mains in the Noe Valley neighborhood of San Francisco. This action constitutes the Approval Action for the Project for the purposes of the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA), pursuant to San Francisco Administrative Code section 31.04(h). The Planning Department has determined that the Project is exempt from the CEQA. The Commission will rely on that determination to make its decision on this action. (Robinson)
- f) Accept work performed by Precision Engineering, Inc., under <u>Contract No. WW-679</u>, Various Locations Sewer Replacement No. 8; approve Modification No. 3 (Final) increasing the contract amount by \$134,977 for a total contract amount of \$4,547,839, and no change to contract duration for a total contract duration of 573 consecutive calendar days (approximately one year and seven months) to adjust 11the final contract quantities to the match the actual contract quantities; and authorize final payment to the contractor. - g) Accept work performed by KJ Woods Construction, Inc., under <u>Contract No. WW-711</u>, Wawona Area Stormwater Improvement and Vicente Street Water Main Replacement; approve Modification No. 8 (Final) decreasing the contract amount by \$1,653,043, for a total contract amount of \$29,164,740 and decrease the contract duration by 35 consecutive calendar days for a new total contract duration of 964 consecutive calendar days (approximately two year and eight months); and authorize final payment to the contractor. - h) Award <u>Contract No. WW-725</u>, Various Locations Sewer Replacement No. 14, to the responsible bidder that submitted the lowest responsive bid, JDB & Sons Construction, Inc., in the amount of \$7,987,500 and with a duration of 492 consecutive calendar days (approximately one year and four months), to replace/line existing sewers on specified streets in the City and County of San Francisco. This action constitutes the Approval Action for the Project for the purposes of the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) pursuant to Section 31.04(h) of the San Francisco Administrative Code. The Planning Department has determined that this action is exempt from the CEQA. If the item is approved, the Commission will rely on that determination to make its decision. (Robinson)
- Award <u>Contract No. WW-738</u>, East SOMA Sewer Improvements, to the responsible bidder that submitted the lowest responsive bid, NTK Construction, Inc., in the amount \$10,802,800 with a duration of 425 consecutive calendar days (approximately one year and two months), to rehabilitate and replace large diameter sewers and laterals on specified streets within the City and County of San Francisco. This action constitutes the Approval Action for the Project for the purposes of the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA), pursuant to San Francisco Administrative Code section 31.04(h). The Planning Department has determined that the Project is exempt from the CEQA. The Commission will rely on that determination to make its decision on this action. (Robinson)
- j) Award <u>Contract No. WW-748</u>, As-Needed Spot Sewer Replacement No. 45, to the responsible bidder that submitted the lowest responsive bid, J. Flores Construction Company, Inc., in the amount of \$9,881,978, with a duration of 400 consecutive calendar days

(approximately one year and one month), to replace sections of existing sewer pipe on an asneeded basis at locations that staff will determine throughout the City and County of San Francisco. (Robinson)
