


Leak Alert Program: Our automated meter reading system receives hourly water usage data. When a residential property has shown continuous water use, we send notifications via email, text or voice mail. Update your contact information in My Account to get timely leak alerts.

Is Your Property Due For Efficiency Improvements? It's The Law!

OUTDOOR REQUIREMENTS

New or remodeled landscapes of 500 square feet or more are required to comply with the Water Efficient Landscape ordinance. Projects must install and maintain efficient irrigation systems and low water-use plants, and set a Maximum Applied Water Allowance, also known as an annual water budget.

INDOOR REQUIREMENTS

Residential and commercial property owners are required to repair plumbing leaks and replace old water-wasting toilets, urinals, showerheads, and faucets with water-efficient models. Residential properties are required to replace old fixtures upon sale or remodel. Commercial properties were required to comply by January 2017.

Water-Wise Tips



- Turn off the tap while brushing your teeth, shaving, or washing dishes.



- Operate your clothes washer and dishwasher with full loads.



- Repair or immediately report plumbing fixture leaks.



- Report water waste by calling 311 or visiting SF311.org.



- Replace inefficient toilets, urinals and washing machines.



- Use water-efficient showerheads and aerators.*



- Sign-up for a Water-Wise Evaluation.*



- Use a broom to clean pavement instead of a hose.



- Prevent irrigation overspray onto hardscapes.



- Water plants between 8 pm and 10 am to reduce evaporation.
